February 2024 - When God's People Pray

The following books were written for God's people at very different times and under very different circumstances. However, each of these show our need for God and what happens when we repent and turn to Him. Ephesians, written by the apostle Paul, was the letter sent to the church at Ephesus (modern-day Turkey) reminding people who they are in Christ and that we are saved by grace through faith. Paul thanks God for them, praying for them and encouraging them to pray and to walk in a manner worthy of Jesus in all areas of life. The books of Ezra and Nehemiah (both most likely written by Ezra) tell the story of the exiles return to Jerusalem and the rebuilding of the temple and the wall around the city. There are many ups and downs throughout this process but both books end with prayers of confession from God's people and a turning from sin and being made right with God, at least for a time. We, likewise, as God's people must always pray and seek His face through the good times and bad, knowing that everything we have is a "gift of God".
