

Our Omnipotent God Discussion Questions

Jeremiah 32:17

1. What would you say is the most powerful thing on earth? Why?
2. What is the least powerful thing on earth? Why?
3. How does God's power make your answer to question one seem as weak as or weaker than your answer to question two?
4. When we use our power we become tired. Why? How does this help us to understand that God does not get tired?
5. How does it make you feel to know that God made you exactly the way you are in your mother's womb?
6. Of the seven things God can't do, which surprises you the most? Why? Which are you the most grateful for? Why?
7. Why is it important for us to try to understand God's omnipotence even though we will never be able to completely understand it?
8. What do you think of when you hear that El Shaddai means "The One mighty to nourish and satisfy?" What does He nourish and satisfy?
9. Why was it important for Jeremiah not only to give the message of destruction, but also of restoration?
10. What was God communicating to Jeremiah and the Israelites by having him purchase land during this time?
11. Is God trying to send this message to you in the middle of a difficult time in your life? How are you holding on to this message?
12. What about Jeremiah's situation would lead him not only to pray, but praise God and recount what God had done in the past?
13. What has God done for you in the past? Have you praised Him for these things? Are you praising God for things He hasn't done yet?
14. Are you praising God for answers you don't like now, but are trusting God is doing what is best for His kingdom? Why is this hard to do? Why don't we think to praise God for these answers? Why is it important for us to praise God in these circumstances?

15. Sarah found it hard to believe God could do the impossible and she laughed. Have you found it hard to believe God can do the impossible only to see him do it anyway? Would you briefly share what God did and how it grew your faith?
16. If we know nothing is impossible with God, why don't we take all our problems whether great or small to God first? Why do we try to take care of it ourselves first then hand it over to God when we have made a mess of things? Why don't we want to give him the small problems?
17. How can you use God's power to change something in your life you don't think you can change to become more like God?
18. Why do we have to be weak to get God's power?
19. What is your major problem you have a hard time trusting God with right now? Have you been praying about it? If so and you don't see any change, could it be possible you may not be praying for the right thing (such as praying for the symptoms, but not the root of the problem)?
20. Have you ever been afraid to witness to someone? Will you share your experience?
21. How can we rely on God's power when we face these types of times that scare us or make us nervous? Will you pray for God to lead you to someone this week that you can share the Gospel with and invite to church?
22. Is there a sin, bad habit, hurt, or hang up that you need to ask God to blow up in your life? Why don't you? Are you afraid of the change it will bring? Why?
