

Inviting a Decision Discussion Questions

Acts 9:36-42; John 4:1-42

1. How have you been intentional this week with your witnessing?
2. Is it your habit to help people? If yes, what do you do to be known as someone who helps? If not, what would people know you for?
3. How can ministering to believers impact and witness to unbelievers? Should we limit our service to believers only? Why or why not? How are you ministering to unbelievers?
4. What are some things we can do in our community that would be a service to the community and a witness about Christ as well?
5. When you are serving or doing acts of kindness, how can you relate your service to what God has done for them in a verbal way?
6. How did Jesus go against His culture to witness to the Samaritan women? In what ways do we need to do the same thing today to witness to others?
7. In your salvation process, what were some steps taken by others to reach you and what steps did you take to come to faith in Christ?
8. When you first became a Christian, how did you act? How many people were you telling about Christ? Has that changed over the years? Why or why not? How can you get that zeal back?
9. Which questions do you sue to raise people's curiosity about Christ and get them to think about their life and situation?
10. Have you ever seen someone come to Christ through the sharing of your testimony of what Christ has done in you? Would you briefly share your experience?
11. What can be discouraging about this approach? How do you fight this and continue to witness after you have shared your testimony?
12. Which of the six approaches fits you best? Why?
13. Which approach do you use the most?
14. Which approach do you feel the most uncomfortable with? What would make you feel more comfortable about using this approach when the situation calls for it?
15. How does knowing these different styles, the traits, and cautions of each help you with your witnessing?
16. Does asking "What if I'm fifteen" help you to be bolder with your witnessing? Why or why not?
