4. How has a person from an older generation helped you?
5. How has a person from a younger generation helped you?
6. How can the generations work together better to help each other understand the other and to help us grow in the Lord and do His work?
7. What is important about each of the key doctrines (incarnation, crucifixion, resurrection ascension, exaltation, and consummation) that Peter would take time to discuss each one in his message (refer to Acts 2:22-35).
8. How are we all guilty of crucifying Christ?
9. In the sermon, Brian mentioned that "preaching must become personal." How can we personalize the message we heard this weekend?
10. According to John 16:8, the Holy Spirit come to convict the world of sin, righteousness, and judgment. What is He convicting you of? Is there something you need to stop doing? Is there something you need to be doing?
11. What commitment are you willing to make?
12. How can we live in the world and have an impact on it yet not be corrupted by the world?
