1. What is meant by a buffet-style Christianity? Why isn't this not Christianity?
2. What are some sins people may think is unforgiveable by God? Is any of these true? Why not?
3. What was Saul going around doing to Christians? Why was he doing this?
4. What changed Saul's mind?
5. What did three days of blindness, not eating and not drinking allow for Saul to do?
6. Have you ever taken time like this to contemplate the condition of your Spiritual life and beliefs? If so, what benefits comes from this? What is the purpose of doing this?
7. Have you found yourself in a situation like Ananias where you didn't want to do what God wanted you to do out of fear? What was your situation? What did you end up doing and how did that make you feel? If you could go back and do it differently, what would you do?
8. Do you feel like you are a chosen instrument for God to use? Why or why not?
9. What is God calling you to do?
10. Would you be able to go up to someone who was an enemy that God called you to go to and call him a brother or sister the way Ananias did? What gave Ananias the courage and confidence to do this? Can we gain this courage and confidence for ourselves? What do we have to do to obtain it?
11. Have you felt like you are too sinful to be saved? What have you learned and what would you like to do about it?
12. Who are you praying for to become saved? When was the last time you prayed for them?
13. Read Philippians 1:29. Why are we to prepare for persecution if we are Christians?
14. Do you have a testimony to tell? Read Acts 26. Following the outline from Paul with King Agrippa, what is your testimony?
15. Are you having any unity issues with other believers over some polarizing issues that are going on right now? How do you plan to maintain unity with other believers that disagree with your point of view? How can you put yourself in the other person's shoes?
16. How can we disagree and still be in unity? What is central about Christianity?
