1. Read Deuteronomy 6:4-9, 11:13-21, and Numbers 15:37-41. Why would these verses be recited as a prayer every morning and evening? What should we take away from these verses for our lives today?
2. How is this command based on love?
3. Read 1 John 4: 7-12. What do these verses tell us about the people who love others? What do these verses tell us about the people who don't love others? How are you doing with loving others?
4. What does it mean to love God with your total being?
5. How does someone show he loves God with unreserved devotion? Would people watching you say that you love God with unreserved devotion? If not, what or who would they say you love?
6. If you have children, how are you teaching them God's Word? How often are you doing this? If you don't have children of your own, how are you teaching God's Word to the children around you?
7. How are you showing God's love to others?
8. How do you define success?
9. If you have children, what kind of example would your children say you are being for them to follow regarding your spiritual life? If you don't have children, what kind of example would those closest to you say you are being regarding your spiritual life?
10. What area would you say you need to work on the most to be a better example to others?
11. What can we do to fulfill Deuteronomy 6:8-9? How can you enlist your kids in doing this more?
12. What is the danger we face if we don't intentionally teach the next generation God's Word?
13. How are you staying accountable for what you watch on TV, see on the internet, etc.? How are you teaching your children about what they watch and see on the internet? How are you holding them accountable?
14. How are you reaching out to and teaching children that are not yours about God's Word?
